Attendance and Punctuality

This remains a big concern for the school. Our current attendance figure is just 93.8% which is a decline on this time last year and way off the national average of 96%! In comparison, Barkerend Primary School's figure is 96.8%!!

Bradford City Council and our Governing Body have instructed me to 'get tough' with those families whose children have poor attendance and/or are persistently late to school in the morning.

If a child has poor attendance at school in their primary school years they are far more likely NOT to achieve 5 GCSEs (A-C) at the end of secondary school; in other words, they are being set up to fail the education system.

It is the responsibility of ALL parents/carers to make sure their child(ren) attend school EVERY school day. By keeping children away from school parents/carers are letting their child down and letting the school down.

We will be stepping up our efforts to improve attendance and punctuality after Easter.
