Science

Our topic this term is plants. Children will learn what a plant needs to grow, as well as naming and identifying parts of the

Maths

In Maths, we will be focusing on place value within 50. We will also be learning how to measure length, height, mass and volume. We will be using the concreate, pictorial and abstract method to develop our understanding.

Art

In Art this term, we are focusing on printing. We will be using vegetables and objects that have a pattern. We will also be using the relief printing method to create a final piece.

PE

Outdoors, we will be learning how to play Basketball and indoors we will be learning how to move our body confidently and safely through dance.

PSHCE

In PSHCE, children will identify who our special people are and who they can talk to, as well as identify jobs in the community and how they help us.

RE
