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The sports funding at Peel Park Primary School supports provision for the following-

- Additional PE and PA opportunities outside of the curriculum lessons which poverty proofs our school under the categories of 'Talent', 'Sports Lovers', 'Fitness' and additional SEN PE.
- Enhanced PE curriculum developed to fit the needs of our pubils and maximizing our facilities and matched to the wider sporting and PA opportunities in the local area and sporting competition.
- The opportunity to participate in the full BD3 League which is hosted at Carlton Bolling (We continue to play a key role in the success of this widely valued resource).
- We send two teams (at least) to almost every competition and have competitions targeted for competition as well as a wide range of opportunities for SEN children. This again increased on last year.
- Opportunities for talented children to receive additional coaching in these areas for curated sport specific list (We know who are gifted children are in each traditional sport). This resulted in particularly strong performances in girls' football and boys' cricket.
- Children are fully prepared to participate in external competition and we had our most successful year yet.
- Opportunities for SEN children to receive additional coaching and opportunities to participate in competitions such as Boccia and New Age Kurling with increased success.
- Additional opportunities for children who need additional physical activity to be 'fit and healthy' (The number of children needing this is slowly falling).
- 'Healthy Schools Week' which is a 'wow' event that provides the children with a week of fun and engaging activities. (Detailed plan available on request)
- We provide a comprehensive PE and PA provision for all children, of all abilities and sporting/pa interests.
- Additional PA activity opportunities are provided for those most in need.
- A wide selection of high-quality equipment to maximize the quality of learning with all equipment in correct and appropriate sizes for all ages.

Impact of the PE and Sports Grant in 2024-25

- A comprehensive in school Gifted and Talented program which has allowed us to both participate and be successful in school games competitions and the now established BD3 League.
- We have fully embedded the above model in gender specific groups for Y5/6
- We had children qualify for the West Yorkshire Cross Country finals and our 11-cricket team came in the top 10 in West Yorkshire.
- Regular top place finishes in the BD3 League for both our boys' and girls' teams (Girls now sometimes outperform the boys).
- Approximately 250 pupils across school from Years 1-6 attend after school clubs have access to a sport based after school club.
- The importance of diet and nutrition delivered to the children and they understand that exercise doesn't always mean traditional sports.
- The impact of the premium funding is sustainable due to the upskilling of our teachers in effective sports teaching, development of skills and broader experiences of sport.
- Pupil's fitness and sporting ability is sustained as each year builds on the previous and expectations of what pupils can do are increased.
- Further improved PE curriculum that provides opportunities for children to broaden their experience and challenge is available to the ablest.
- PE is a key part of life at Peel Park and children are proud to and want to represent the school in external competitions with further increased opportunity to do so (See our Sporting Superstars Display).
- As well as additional sport for gifted children, children who love sport but struggle to make these teams received additional coaching during school time deepening the love of sport at our school. This is now more widely offered along with opportunities for SEN children (We have specific training sessions for all of our teams).
- Further increased percentage of children who choose to be active
- As of the end of the 25 academic year, we now have 3 girls at Bradford City Girls Academy and 2 boys at the Bradford City Development Centre. I boy continues to play for Yorkshire CCC.
- One of our female footballers came in the top 8 of Premier League sporting success stories
- Children's fitness and physical activity levels continue to increase.
- PE was 'deep dived' by Ofsted and proven to be strong in both the curriculum offer and the wider offer.

Future Plans and Proposals

- To further increase the quality and the quantity Talented provision focusing on areas of specific children's needs.
- To continue to tackle the problem of obesity within our school by providing additional PA for these children (This sadly has to remain despite considerable progress).
- To continue to maintain the now very similar performance of our boys' and girls' sports teams
- Further increase the number of talented children who are attached to external clubs.
- Further develop and freshen up 'Healthy Schools Week'.
- Further increase the quality of our dance and gymnastics provision in PE lessons.
- Ensure the portable swimming pool increases outcomes for Y5 and Y6. (This was put on hold last year due to reasons beyond our control)
- Continue to play and active role in the BD3 games and have further success in school games events
- Review whether or not dodgeball is an appropriate use of curriculum time
- Continue to effectively use our relationships with groups such as Bradford City and Bike Futures.

Breaks and lunchtimes are active but in need of a refresh.

Parents have received training and support with packed lunches

Children meeting professional sports players to inspire them and we've had the Premier League trophy in

We have pupils who have signed for professional football and cricket clubs

We continue to work closely with other schools and our offer and way of working is highly respected.

We have delivered 'open classroom' events and also presented to Sports England and at CAS Conferences all of which was well received.

Pupil voice continues to be responded to.

Healthy Schools Week and a sports day that meets the wants and needs of all children.

Children from Nursery to Y6 all receive additional PE and PA opportunities.

Along with our longstanding relationship with the Bradford City Community Foundation, we now have a strong relationship with Bradford City Women and Girls and the Bradford City Football and Education. Our relationship with Bike Futures goes from strength to strength with him numbers of children able to cycle at our school.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

Girls to continue to have similar success in external competition performance Further increase the quality and quantity of the Talent and SEN provision (Sport Specific for KS2 and continuing to be gender specific in Y5/6)

Refresh and rezone our playground to further increase PA at break and lunch. Monitor the improved KSI offer and review Beyond the Physical

Continue to provide opportunities for children who are not 'fit and healthy' Explore further opportunities to build links with other sporting teams and clubs Considerably improve the swimming outcomes for our school by using a portable pool on the school site (This was delayed due to unforeseen circumstances) Further increase the number of children with the ability to be put forward for

Ensure outdoor learning is fully embedded (We have another staff member specifically leading on this)

Ensure new teachers are clear on our PE and PA expectations and the 'Team Peel Park' ethos
