Maths

English

Science

We are beginning an exciting topic about animals including humans. In particular we are learning about nutrition and how the food we

eat affects our bodies. We will also be studying skeletons and learning how food keeps our bones healthy. We will look at how skeletons of different animals vary.



History

Ancient Egypt

Children will explore the fascinating life of the Ancient Egyptians. They will learn about the Egyptian beliefs and what daily life was like. We will look at how some aspects of Ancient Egyptian life can still be seen today.

Design and Technology



This half term we will be working on structures where children will be constructing castles out of recycled materials. To do this they will be looking at the features of castles, understanding 3D shapes and how to assemble geometric shapes. They will utilise skills to build a complex structure from these shapes.

Physical Education

In PE, we will be working on our cricket skills (Outdoor) and focusing on the target game of Dodgeball (Indoor). Remember that all classes have PE on a Monday and a Friday.
