Music

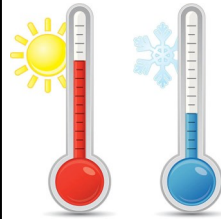
Our focus this term is Jazz. This unit allows the children to listen to and review Jazz music. They will then have the opportunity to compare Jazz to other musical genres.

We will be learning about conflicts which occurred in the Twentieth Century. The children will focus on World War one and World War two. Consequences of these events will be discussed in detail.

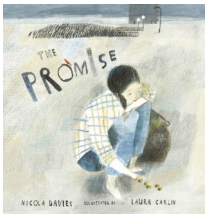


Science
