

Terraced houses are lots of houses all joined together in a row. They are usually quite narrow.




# Semi-detached

Round houses were first built in the past, around the time of the Bronze age.

They were built into mounds of rubbish known as midden. This could include small stones, shells, mud and animal bones.

It would provide some stability as well as insulation.

These houses were usually round.

They had beds and storage shelves, and a hearth in the middle.



None of these houses remain, but we can see the foundations. Some houses used wattle and daub (a mixture of clay, mud and hay stuck to sticks that have been woven in and out of the timber frame) for the walls and had thatched roofs.
