## **Reading at Home**

Reading is the most important thing that your child can learn to do. It is important that your child reads every day at home with you for at least 20 minutes. You can read with them or just listen to them or even ask questions about what they've been reading. You can also talk about what you enjoy reading. Your Child's reading book and reading record will come home every day. Please try and ensure this is completed every day. Even older children with longer books should be looking to finish a book and change them every week. Their books are changed frequently during the week.

## Uniform

More and more families are asking if their children can wear school uniform. At the moment, we are currently not enforcing our school uniform policy, however, if you would like to send your child in uniform we would support this.

# What's been happening in school?

This week in Nursery we have been focusing on the story, The Very Hungry Caterpillar. We enjoyed tasting different fruits, including pomegranate and raspberries. The Thrive room children have been preparing their outdoor growing area. They have planted sunflower and cosmos seeds.








In Year 6, they have been enjoying their class novel 'Can You See Me?' This is the story of a girl who tries to hide her autism as she starts secondary school. The book was co-authored by Libby Scott- a girl who has autism and includes moving diary entries by Libby explaining her own experiences. The book is helping us to empathise with people who face challenges and think about our own transition to secondary school.
