## Year 6 Autumn 1 2023

## English

Our term will begin with classic poetry. We will then look at traditional tales which contain suspense and fear. Children will look at how the setting can aid the reader identify the genre. In non-fiction we will be looking at balanced arguments. The children will have lots of opportunities to orally practice debating in class. They will then be discussing if the Industrial Revolution benefitted (or did not benefit) Britain.

Χ= building on from skills learnt in previous years on the topic of place value. From here we will focus on the key arithmetic skills of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will practise solving calculations both mentally and using formal written methods. We will also identify multiples, factors and prime numbers before learning how to use the 'BIDMAS' order of operations to solve calculations. Regular arithmetic tests will take place to identify areas of strength and those needing more practise.

**History** We will be learning about the Industrial Revolution; the developments made during this period of British history and the lasting impact it has had on our society. We will focus on changes to employment with the development of the factories and mills, the lifestyles and health of the workers, inventions and changes to the political system at this time. We will be visiting Bradford Industrial Museum for a day to get a hands-on experience of a Victorian schoolroom and to see the mill machinery in action.



**French** We will begin with focusing on the phonetic pronunciation of French vocabulary before practicing basic conversational language including introducing and describing ourselves.





**Science** We will be focusing on electricity this half term.

We will learn about the history of electricity and how it is used. We will build simple electrical circuits and investigate what happens when there are missing components and observe the effects of changing circuits

DI This is a very exciting half-term. The children are making celebration cakes. They

will have the opportunity to taste ingredients. After tasting, they will design their cakes and bake them in the school kitchen. They will be whisking, stirring and sieving to make the ultimate celebration cake out of a baked bean tin!



**Guided Reading** We will be exploring our history and science topics through Guided Reading– discovering more about chemical reactions, learning about key figures from the Industrial Revolution and enjoying extracts from authors of this era. Our class reader, Street Child, will also develop our understanding of life for children in Victorian London.





**RE** We will be considering forgiveness and when and why we should forgive others. We will learn about what Jesus taught about forgiveness and reconciliation and how forgiveness and reconciliation is shown in real life
