Peel Park Primary School Good to be Green Positive Behaviour Guide





	Green Card	 Pupils who follow our school rules will stay on GREEN every day. The idea is that classes work as a team to encourage each other to stay on green, this is a whole school approach. Our school rules are: Always follow a learning or safety instruction from a known adult in school. Keep your body and objects to yourself. Always speak politely and be respectful to others.
	Verbal Warning	If a school rule is broken the first step will be for a member of staff to speak to the pupil to discuss what they have done and to encourage them to reflect and stay on green.
	Turned Card	If a pupil continues to break the school rules their green card will be turned on its side. A class behaviour buddy should be used to talk to the pupil / support them. *
	Yellow Card	Following a turned card a yellow card will be given. This means the pupil will no longer be on green and this will be logged and tracked on the class monitoring chart.
	Blue Card – stop and think!	The blue card is the final stage before a red card is given. If a pupil is given a blue card they complete a refection sheet in another class in their year group. Reflection form to KN and 2 week monitoring begins.
	Red Card	If a pupil is given a red card they are taken to a member of SLT and parents are informed. They are put on a 2 weeks monitoring record and checked daily by KN or a member of SLT.
 Good to be Green Monitors and Rewards The aim is for children to stay on GREEN and this is what we all need to encourage every day! Each class has 2 Good to be Green Monitors who log the number of children in the class who have stayed on green each week. A token is given to the class with the most children on green from each phase each week. At the end of each half term the class with the most tokens receives a reward. These are recorded on a display outside KN's room. Individuals who have stayed on green every day all year will receive a certificate / sticker or badge at the end of the school year. 		
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Exemptions from Good to be Green: There are some children in school who need some adaptions to the policy for different reasons. These children will have specific behaviour plans and copies will be given to relevant staff.
