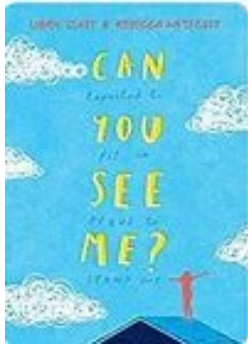


Year 6 Summer 2 2026

We will then move on to read Torn Apart, an equally evocative tale of fleeing persecution (set during The Partition of India).

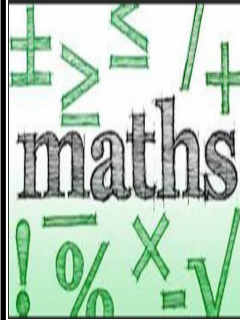


In Geography, we will be learning more about map skills and digital navigation. This will be framed within our transition to secondary school—we will explore practical tools online (such as Google Maps) to plan our journeys to our local secondary schools.

In History, we will finish our WW2 unit before moving on to examine The Partition of India. We will consider how Britain colonized India through the British East India Company and Empire. The influence of key political figures will also be considered.



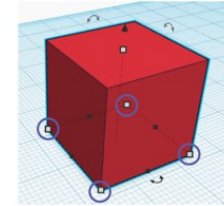
In DT, we will be using TinkerCad to design a multi-functional trekking device.



In preparation for secondary school, we will continue to revise all aspects of the Year 6 curriculum; we will consolidate our arithmetic skills and apply our knowledge to problem solving and reasoning questions.

We will undertake wider mathematical projects and investigations .

In computing, linked to DT, we will use Tinker Cad to explore 3D modelling. We will learning how to manipulate different shapes using handles.



This half term is very exciting as the children will take part in even more Outdoor Learning. This will take place in the Forest School and will be a welcome change of environment from the classroom.

The children will focus on working in teams and building up their resilience and communication skills.



In RE, we will discuss rites of passages and how children of different faiths assume responsibilities as they grow up.

We will continue our school focus on oracy—how we talk and listen to each other. We will use our talk rules in every lesson and make sure we use our sentence structure starters.



Please ensure that children read regularly (ideally every night) and that they use Times Table Rock Stars and Spelling Shed to practice their Maths and English skills

Most importantly, this half term, pupils and teacher will be liaising with secondary schools in order to ensure a smooth transition to Year 7.



In PE, we will ensure that our children continue to remain as healthy and active as possible. We will develop our athletic abilities in preparation for Sports Day taking part in activities such as relay races and the long jump.
